PHYSIOLOGY AND HYGIENE.

Furnishing of the Microscopic, etc.

Foreign medical journals have reported
several cases of infants dying during the
past summer. In four of the cases a whole
intestine was taken, and in the fifth one five
whole intestines.

The following instances particularly note-

intestine which produced the symptoms, and
secondly, for the very marked effect on the
heart and circulation. The patient, a strong,
healthy woman, granted the autopsy, and
found it with a piece of intestine, which she
thought at bottom. An hour after she felt
some nausea, but went to sleep. Awoke
about 9 a. m., feeling very cold and with a
sensation of prickling in the skin, and while
her "heart beating" at a rapid pace.

When a physician, Dr. Finck, of Victoria,
Australia, met her, two hours later, the sur-
face of the body was everywhere cold and
pale; pupils dilated, respiration sighing, and
pulse almost imperceptible and uncountable.
The doctor gave her five brandy and water
immediately, and standard applications to
stimulate and extricate; she a mustard
bath.

As this did not act, and the patient
became more and more exhausted, she was
placed in a warm bath, and the mustard
bath continued, and the patient recovered.
After taking some more hot brandy and
water, she went to sleep. Next day she
was much better, and the day after was fully re-
covered, and able to attend to household
duties.
