HARROWING SCENES DURING THE BURNING OF A BUILDING—SOME FLING THEMSELVES FROM FIVE-STORY WINDOWS, OTHERS ARE BURNED.

PHILADELPHIA TRAGEDY. A fire at Landenberg's mill last night originated in a finishing room on the second floor.
