General Sir Archibald Murray, who has just been appointed Chief of the Imperial General Staff, is one of our youngest and most brilliant generals. Fifty-five years of age, he entered the Army at the age of nineteen, and at twenty-seven was a captain. General Murray first saw active

service in the Zululand campaign of 1888. His greatest experience of war -excepting the present one, of course -was, however, in South Africa In the South African War he gained a great reputation for handling America and which has never taken men. He was not only mentioned a number of times in despatches, but he was awarded the D.S.O., added seven clasps to his medals for the battles in which he took part, and emerged from the war a full colonel. From 1907 to 1912 Sir Archibald was Director of Military training, and from the latter year till the war broke out he was Inspector of Infan-


