### The Battle of Salamanca

This battle, which was fought on July 22, 1812, was the first great victory of the British and their allies in the Peninsula war. Up to that time Napoleon and his marshals had regarded Wellington as only a "sape general," whom they would soon overthrow. Salamanca showed them that error. The French general opposed Wellington was Marmont, a very skillful tactician. For a month before the battle the opposing armies had marched and countermarched round each other, each trying to force the other into a bad position where it could be destroyed. This style of warfare is very different and much more interesting than the trench fighting which has been compulsory in the recent war. The opposing armies were about equal in numbers, and the strategy shown by both generals was notable. Wellington, by July 22, had arranged his army on a line of hill running almost north and south in front of Salamanca, his right being on the village of Arapiles, and his left on the Tormes river. Between the British and the French were two separate hills called the Atapiles, for which the armies raced, each securing one. Wellington saw that the object of the French, was to strike at the Ciudad Rodrigo road and cut off his retreat, and he met this by swinging his army round till it was nearly east to west. Marmont thought Wellington was retreating, and sent his army in pursuit, which made a wide opening in the centre of the French line, and Wellington saw the error, and issued a few rapid orders which set his troops in motion. Par attacked the French right and the hill they had taken, and the others as called the flank of the French left the head of the French column making for the Ciudad Rodrigo road which expected no enemy in its front suddenly found itself confronted by a division which Wellington had sent round a long distance. Both armies were soon engaged in fierce fighting and at suitable moments Wellington sent in the British cavalry which charged again and again. By nightfall the French were in full retreat.

### St. Mary

#### Magdalen Error.

July 22 is the festival in the present Church of England Prayer Book of Mary Magdalene, or of Magdala (Matthew xv. 39), on the west shore of the Sea of Galilee; and in the Prayer Book of A.D. 1549 it was St. Mary's Day, with its title in red letters, like those of the Apostles, with Collect, Epistle and Gospel. This change was made probably because until the Bible was translated into English and printed, so little was generally known of its contents that in these authorized services, and accordingly by most people, she was confused with Mary, the sister of Lazarus, as when Chaucer, the British poet, in A.D. 1386 wrote "Judith gruded, or grumbled against the Magdalene," (John xii. 3-5), and she was mistaken also for the fallen but penitent woman who washed Christ's feet with her tears. (Luke vii. 36-50). The division of the Bible into chapters and verses is very useful, but in this case may prevent people from observing that the account of this penitent at the end of one chapter is followed two verses later by the introduction of Mary Magdalene as an entirely fresh person, which any reader, with ordinary intelligence, must see. She was one of those comparatively wealthy women who helped to supply the wants of Christ and His Apostles, and she was attached to Him out of gratitude because she had been cured by Him of that mischievous or melancholy madness which was by the Jews considered, as still by natives of India, to be possession by powerful evil spirits. Therefore she continued with Him till the end, one of those "first at the cross and earliest at the tomb." But through this careless confusion a asylum for the recovery of fallen women were called Magdalen Hospitals when such were first founded.
