Denver Doctor Tests Invention That Will Revolutionize Railroad Operation

By Aid of Electricity Motive Power Controlled as by Human Energies

ENVER, Colo., Aug. 22—Over 150 people witnessed the dem-onstration of the Wooding railway warning device on the Moffat road, near the city limits yesterday afternoon. According to Dr. B. F. Wooding the inventor of the device, it would be impossible for railroad collisions kinds and wrecks caused by a brok en rail if the engines and road were equipped with the device. He showed that the train would stop even if th engineer was asleep or had died, and that in order to start the train again ne air had to be released by the en ineer or fireman. As soon as the ation of the device a shrill whist ounded in the cab, which could be eard above the noise of the locomotive. This whistle is an additional warning to the engineer that the track

is not clear, and in the event that he was asleep it would wake him.
