Synopsis of the Ontario Official Bulletin.

Nearly 10,000,000 Bushels of Wheat More Than Last Year.

Wheat in Britain is Below the Average—The Outlook in Other Countries.

Toronto, Aug. 21.—Following is a synopsis of the Ontario Government August crop bulletin:

The statement of acreage of crops in Ontario for 1897, prepared by the Ontario department of agriculture, and the estimate of yields, based on the reports of the regular correspondents of the department, under date of Aug. 9, show that the yields of the present year, on the whole, promise to exceed those of 1896, and also to exceed the average of the fifteen years, 1882-96. The amount of all wheat plowed up this year was 55,000 acres, or 30,000 less than in 1896. With an increased area of 73,000 acres, the promise at present is nearly 10,000,000 bushels greater than was reported a year ago. The high average of 25.5 bushels per acre is estimated. The comment, "Best crop for many years" is quite common.

Spring wheat has taken a move up again, both in acreage and promise of yield.

The acreage and yield of barley are both somewhat below the previous year.

For several years the area sown to oats has been increasing. Over 5,000 acres are again added this year, and the yield promises 4,000,000 bushels greater than last year. In round figures the crop is estimated at 5,000,000 bushels.

The yields of rye and beans are above the average, and that of peas below the average.

Though in some eastern sections the yield was light, on the whole the hay crop of Ontario has been heavy and above the average, the total being 3,811,518 tons, as against 2,290,240 last year.

The acreage of corn has been increasing year by year, and it has now increased to 54,935—three times that of five years ago.

Buckwheat and mangolds show an increase in area; potatoes, a decrease, while carrots and turnips are both above the average.

Hail storms and heavy showers of rain have done considerable damage to spring grain crops, and in many sections barley is reported to be colored.

The universal report is good pasture, and cattle appear to be in first-class condition. Chickens are doing well, and are generally supplied with milk and dairy prospects generally were favorable.
