### TO MOVE TORONTO IN ANTRY HERE

Would Be Much Better Than to Close the London School-The Instructors.

Most vigorous protests have been forwarded to the government at Ottawa against any change involving the closing of the London Military School. Mr. W. S. Calvert, M.P., has written, protesting strongly in the interests of Western Ontario, and other western members have added their protest. Col. Leys, M.P.P., who went to Ottawa to protest personally, says it would be much better to bring the Toronto infantry to London. The only reason for taking the London company to Toronto is said to be that London has a corner on the only que ed instructors in the · Toronto instructors two districts. were allowed to go to the Transvaai. The London instructors, though anxious to go, were refused permission by Col. # OF 10 PER CENT

To Be Paid 28,000 Cotton-Mill Opera tives-Other Labor News.

Fall River, Mass., Dec. 2.-All the cotton manufacturers of the city represented in the Fall River Association yesterday decided that they would grant an advance of 10 per cent instead of 5 per cent in wages, beginning on Monday, Dec. 11. In all about 28,000 hands will benefit by the raise.

PROTEST FROM 80,000. London, Dec. 20.—Representatives of 80,000 cotton and clothworkers have appealed to the home secretary, de-claring they will go out on strike unless the provisions of the law regu-lating the sanitary conditions of fac-tories are enforced. They specified unhealthful violations of the law committed by manufacturers. A vigor-ous prosecution was promised and, as the men apparently made reasonable demands, it is not likely the threatened strike will occur.

TO BLEED EMPLOYERS. Detroit News: Labor men around town who have been delegates to the conventions of the American Federation of Labor are smiling at the scheme of some eastern agency to "hold up" the manufacturers by offering to furnish them with the "secret" meetings of the federation. "All our meetings are open," said Henry J. Elkhoff, who has attended three conventions, "except when we go into executive ses-sion to investigate charges against an officer, or to settle some dispute be-tween rival factions." "I wish every employer of labor in the country could come and attend our meetings," said another delegate. "It would do them good, and us, too."

NOTES. The C. P. R. Railway telegraphers in Toronto state that they will send a deputation to Montreal on Monday next to interview President Shaughnessy, notwithstanding the statement of the president that he had heard of no grievances.

The St. Thomas Trades and Labor Council have arranged to have Eugene V. Debs, the orator and advocate of labor reform, deliver a lecture in that city on Monday, Dec. 18.

The Charges Against Ward Foreman Hamilton For the City.

The city solicitor was instructed, by resolution passed at a special meeting of the city council last night, to act on behalf of the city in the case against Ward Foreman Hamilton, which will be tried before the county judge Monday morning. This decision was not arrived at without some objection. Ald. Carrothers and Ald. Dreaney were both opposed to it, and expressed the opinion that the matter was a personal one between Ald. Malloch, who preferred the charges, and Hamilton. It was pointed out very forcibly, however, by Ald. Parnell, Graham, Plant and Rumball, that the matter very gravely concerned the city, as indicating the manner in which the department is being run. The following resolution, moved by Ald. Par-nell and second by Ald. Pritchard, was adopted: "That the city solicitor be instructed to attend before the county judge in the matter of the charges preferred by Ald.
