# The Williams Tragedy.

Close of the Murder Trial a Brampton.

Walker Acquitted, but MacWhirrel.

The Convicted Man Sentenced to be Hanged on the 1st of June-Mac-Whirrell Makes a Sensational Harangue.

Found Guilty.

(Associated Press Dispatch.) BRAMPTON, March 18.-The great Williams murder trial which has been in progress here for a week ended last night, the jury at 6:45 p.m. bringing in the

following verdict: "The finding of the jury is, MacWhirrell guilty of the murder of James Williams; Walker not guilty." Walker was then remanded back to jail till the Fall Assizes, when he will be tried for the murder of Mrs. Williams.

MACWHIRRELL MAKES A SPEECH. MacWhirrell, when asked if he had anything to say why sentence should not be

passed upon him, said: "Yes, my lord, I have. I'm an innocent man and I wish to let the people see that I'm innocent." Turning to the jurors, he said: "You jurors are responsible for my death." MacWhirrell, with his hands alternately in his pocket or resting on the

dock told A RAMBLING STORY of his movements prior and subsequent to the murder. Then for over an hour he proceeded with his statement, alternately pausing to look up at the ladies' gallery and protesting his innocence and to call God to witness that he was telling the truth. He admitted that he went along the Middle road and the Lake Shore road and called at the Williams house and conversed with the old man on Thursday Dec. 14. He claimed, however, that he never entered the house, and returned to Toronto the same night. He repeated the story about

buying the horse from the men at Scholes' hotel on Friday night and CONTRADICTED EVERY WITNESS CALLED. He stated that the man who bought the horse from him resembled Policeman Cross very much. He denied that he had the knob in his possession when he left Stabelfield's. MacWhirrell kept on with his rambling story for an hour and twenty minutes, when counsel told him to cut it short. He again turned to the jury and said: "You're responsible for my life. I am innecent. I can look any man in the face and say I am innocent. I am not afraid to face death on the scaffold. I am an innocent man, and you are the mur-

derers of MacWhirrell." ADVISES THE JUDGE. At 8:30 MacWhirrell concluded by requesting the judge not to deliver any sympathizing speech, but to just sentence him, and no more about it.

THE SENTENCE. His lordship then sentenced MacWhirrell to be hanged on Friday, June 1. "All right, your lordship," said the prisoner. "I'll have a better chance to get to heaven than some of you, for I'm -The prisoner was promptly suppressed Some women commenced crying, and he shouted out: "Don't cry"; "I'm not afraid to die; I'm no coward."
