RUSHING COAR ACROSS.
North Portal, Sask, Dec. 7.—As a result of the duty of 52 cents a ton on United States soft coal, which was taken off in August, being relimposed on Tuesday night at 12 o'clock, there was a great rush yesterday to get all cars possible over the boundary. During the past 20 hours over 300 cars of coal from the St. Paul gateway entered Canada at this point, 200 cars being consigned to the C. P.
