## FINDS CARNAGE BLIGHTED LIVES OF YOUNGSTERS

Williams Sees Many Obstacles in France To European Comeback.

## PROVE WAR SENSELESS

Complicate Task of Diplomats in Restoring World's Equilibrium.

Whiting Williams, in his tenth article in the London Advertiser, gives more of his personal experience as a day laborer in France, Belgium and Germany.

"Over there was formerly a quiet little village of a few thousand," one of the residents was telling a group of friends up on the hills outside Verdun.

There was not a sign of brick or stone—nothing except a collection of mounds and shell holes. But he was right. The bombardment had had its effect. Everything into the ground that all the bricks and paving stones were far beneath.

It is the same with most of the bodies of the French and German soldiers who died there. They are still unburied. Because they were too many times buried! Burying the collection of heads and arms and legs, brought to the surface by the last shell served only until the next one came.

"This must be for an officer, m'sieur, because it is six inches deeper than the others."

The laborer was from Morocco or Algeria—one of the thousands kept busy burying the war's dead. He has doubtless by this time grown accustomed to these "crosses row on row," which bear the legend of "French unknown," or worse, because nothing but an assortment of human parts could be found. "French unknowns."

The question is "Can Europe 'come back' after such a loss of blood?" It is bad enough for a country to have paid for its security the price which France has paid in more than 50 per cent of its young men of fighting age. It is bad enough for the wives and children of those who remain to accommodate themselves in 600,000 fewer homes than before.

But an even deeper and less obvious wound, perhaps, is one that is not shown by either painted crosses or leaning roofs.

"That's what they all say, but I am 18," replied the little day-laborer at Lens when I said his age was unbelievable. He had been living through

four years of bombardment in the cellars of Lens—living worse than a rat in a drain.

Thousands of children in France have suffered not only from lack of food and shelter, but from the necessity of learning to be thieves. One told me that as a prisoner he had never tasted a square meal unless he could steal it from his captors. Hundreds of thousands of youngsters in Germany are undernourished because of the blockade.

On all sides workmen told me of their troubles—their war troubles—in their homes. In thousands of families divorce and other domestic difficulties have arisen.

Still further, in Germany and especially in Austria and Central Europe, the best educated people are at present suffering most. Though they set the same number of money units as before, the depreciation is so great that sometimes a whole year's salary hardly buys a single suit of clothes.

Such wounds in the heads, hearts and bodies of whole peoples are sad enough to contemplate in comparison with the gains—the scanty gains which have followed from the war. They do

more than prove the foolishness of fighting as a means of settling disputes.

They also complicate enormously the job of the world's statesmen in trying to restore that delicate equilibrium of international relationships which fur-fure domestic jobs.

Fifteen or twenty years from now the world may be surprised at the unbalanced action of some parliament in Germany or France or the Balkans. The reason will have to be sought in the demoralized lives of the children of Europe in 1914-18.

(In tomorrow's London Advertiser Williams jumps from the industrial regions of Europe and looks at the assembly meeting of the League of Nations from a workman's viewpoint.)
