Jacksonville, Fla., April 21.—Pre-paring to return to New York this afternoon in custody of two New York detectives, Edward Cooney, 25, and his wife, Cecilia Cooney, 20, the beautiful bobbed-haired hold-up woman, today confessed to the whole affair, according to Detective F. H. Gray of New York.

The man is said to have confessed to the majority of the charges filed against the pair, and his wife freely talked of the most recent affair, the robbery of the National Biscuit Com pany's plant in Brooklyn, in which one man was seriously injured. The couples waived extradition and told the detectives they would be glad to return to New York and were ready to stand trial.

The two New York detectives broke down the door of their room in a lodging house only to be confronted with a pistol in the woman's hand and two held by the man, but the girl shouted that they would not fire unless the officers shot, and the couple were taken without further
