St. Petersburg, Nov. 8.—Grand Duke Vladimir has resigned the post of commander of the guard and of the military district of St. Petersburg, and the anouncement of his resignation, which has been in the hands of Emperor Nicholas since the degradation of Grand Duke Cyril, his son, because of his marriage with Grand Duchess Victoria, the divorced wife of the Grand Duke of Hesse, is accompanied by a cool and formal manifesto, referring briefly to Grand Duke Vladimir's appointment at the wish of Emperor Alexander III and of his desire to resign on account of ill. health. The manifesto closes with the stereotyped expression of thanks for the Grand Duke's long services.
