M. Richard submits to the Cabinet a Draft of the Treaty Measure.

PARIS, May 20.—M. Richard, Minister of Justice, to-day submitted to the Cabinet a bill making extensive modifications in the Treaty Measure.

The measure is directed against the Anarchist journals, and provides for the imposition of heavy penalties for leading to theft and to disobedience of the army regulations.

It authorizes the seizure of newspapers when it is believed that they intend to publish prohibited matter, without waiting for the matter to appear, and also the arrest of journalists whom there is reason to suspect are engaged in writing articles inciting others to unlawful deeds.

Stanton Discharged—Sentences on Monday.—The Grand Jury Discharged Stanton, who was charged with non-support. The jury returned a verdict of not guilty.
