A Lame Defense.

To save Mayor Fleming, the Globe has thrown up its shield to divert the blows directed against its friend so that they may strike the City Treasurer. This will not answer its purpose.

The charges we made of a sum of \$264,000 having been used for municipal purposes without any authority, but in a way to give an impression of economic administration by Mayor Fleming, is fully admitted to be correct.

The auditorium is merely a piece of ground roofed over, without sides, so that attendants who are seated in the open air are exposed to the elements.

The same committees as were so burthened had \$211,855 left them from 1891. Thus they had had \$127,000 extra funds from sources other than taxation.

Put, then, these financial advantages together, and we find that the Fleming administration had \$422,239 more in the chest in 1891, not in the remotest degree, or to the extent of one dollar, owing to their own policy, or economy, or management.

Now, the Globe states that the difference in controllable expenditures this year is a decrease of \$264,239 compared with 1891. So that, out of \$422,239 extra received by the Mayor only managed to utilize \$264,239, and spent the balance of \$158,000 in some unaccountable and irregular manner.

These figures demonstrate that, when the financial proceedings of this year are exposed, the cry of economy raised in Mr. Fleming's interest is utterly baseless. He was too wanting in attention to his duties, or too "green," as a financial manager, to be able to manage himself in feathers plucked from another bird.

The recent sale of one of the most central city properties is being used by certain papers as evidence that there has been no boom in such real estate, and consequently no collapse of such inflation.

The extent of the boom of suburban properties has been exaggerated. Around every progressive city there are districts which are favorably situated for dwellings attractive to those who desire gardens, lawns and other pleasant and healthful surroundings.

This normal district has been very rapidly developed owing to the admirable street car service having been extended to its borders in every direction.

This district alone can be properly designated "suburban." But beyond its bounds there is the open country, the "rural" district, and most of the trouble in real estate has arisen from a premature attempt to make what is strictly "rural" property into "suburban."
