Canadian Executive Service Overseas. This is a non-profit organization operated since 1967 by a group of Canadian business leaders with the support of the Federal Government through the Canadian International Development Agency. CESO gives direct assistance to individual industries which have problems and need the talent and expertise of qualified people. Requests come to CESO for technical and management assistance from organizations in either the private or public sectors of developing nations. These provide the opportunity for retired Canadians who have technical, professional or executive skills to make voluntary contributions to the nations involved. CESO pays the air fare of the man and his wife to the country selected, and the client organization pays the normal living expenses of the couple while they are abroad. The maximum assignment period is six months.
