DUTY OFFICERS (OSSW)

Also known as Watch Officers, Duty Officers are on duty during off-hours to handle any emergency situation that may arise. All missions are staffed by Duty Officers during off-hours. When you are stationed abroad you can expect to be designated as the Duty Officer at regular intervals throughout your posting. Some divisions in Headquarters also assign Duty Officers during off-hours. The Department itself has a Watch Officer staffing the Ops Centre 24 hours a day, year round.
