Address in reply, 392. Improvement in our business relations with empire due to temporary advantages derived from exchange; unemployment conditions in Montreal; slight increase in employment in Angus railway shops; great economic and social problems unable to be solved because of depression existing; defining hours of labour and submissions to the International Labour Conference; resemblance of the C.C.F. to the Possibilists or Reformists in 1901; evolution of socialistic theories in various countries, 393; views of Count de Mun and Pope Leo XIII on a collectivist society; schemes to relieve unemployment; distress among small property owners in the cities; assistance in similar cases in the United States under the Reconstruction Finance Corporation, 394; investigation into spread between cost of manufactured products and their distribution to consumers; inquiry held in 1919 as to the cost of living; speeches delivered in house showing a lack of social psychology; 395; effect of the concentration of wealth on the state; much discussion at conferences and little legislation enacted; the true interests of Canada should never be opposed to the true interests of the world, 396
