Mr. Speaker: I declare the amendment to the amendment lost.

Mr. Nielsen: Mr. Speaker, I rise on a point of order. I wish to suggest that if you seek unanimous consent, there may be a disposition to provide that unanimous consent. "This House regrets to inform Your Excellency that your ministers have failed to propose measures that would result in lasting and equitable solutions to the hardships imposed by the high level of chronic unemployment that is being experienced in all regions of Canada as a consequence of years of economic mismanagement by your ministers."
