Mr. Pigeon—On Monday next—The following proposed Resolution:—That, in the opinion of this House, the government should consider the advisability of introducing a measure to provide for the adoption of the standard weights and measures of the Metric System as the standard weights and measures for Canada.

Mr. Simpson—On Monday next—The following proposed Resolution:— That, in the opinion of this House, consideration should be given to the advisability of asking the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation to submit a capital expenditure program schedule which will indicate to the people of areas which are not now serviced by the C.B.C.-T.V. network the approximate time at which the C.B.C. plans to provide television network service to the said areas.

Mr. Cardin—On Monday next—The following proposed Resolution:—That, in the opinion of this House, the government should give early consideration to the advisability of the appointment of a board of engineers for the purpose of studying and reporting upon the linking of the St. Lawrence Seaway (River) with the port of New York via the Richelieu River, Lake Champlain and the Hudson River.

Mr. Drysdale—On Monday next—That a Special Committee be appointed to consider the following matters insofar as they are within the Federal jurisdiction dealing with Marriage and Divorce in Canada and matters incidental thereto, and without limiting the generality of the foregoing also to consider as grounds for divorce; adultery, desertion, cruelty, insanity and such other act or acts which would in the opinion of a Court or Judge justify the granting of a divorce in the interests of the parties and such legislation shall come into effect in each province of Canada only upon the decision by the legislative body in each province to adopt the legislation or in the alternative that special acts be passed for each province desirous or revising or amending its present Marriage and Divorce legislation, however should neither of the above legislative alternatives be acceptable to the provinces or be constitutionally valid then the said measure shall be construed and treated like any other Act of Parliament.

Mr. Winch—On Monday next—The following proposed Resolution:—That, in the opinion of this House, Canada should play a more positive role in the strengthening of world peace and to this end the Government of Canada should give consideration to the following policies:

1. Full support of total world disarmament and of all practical proposals and steps toward this end.

2. Planned reduction of expenditures on defence through unification of the three armed services, elimination of waste and obsolete weapons, and the use of such savings for large scale economic aid abroad and/or social progress at home.

3. No nuclear weapons of any category on or over Canadian soil, or in the hands of Canadian forces anywhere.

4. Support for the cessation of all nuclear tests and (a) The confining of nuclear weapons to the two major powers at this time, (b) The eventual elimination of all nuclear weapons.
