MOTIONS.

For Wednesday, 9th May, 1883.

By the Honorable Mr. *Haythorne* :—

1883.
1 May 7—That an humble Address be presented to His Excellency the Governor General, praying His Excellency will cause to be laid before this House, a copy of the judgment lately delivered in the Supreme Court, in the appeal case of the Queen *vs. McLeod*, and of the Queen *vs. Stewart*; also, of the opinions, if any, expressed by the dissenting Judges, *Fournier J.* and *Henry J.*

By the Honorable Sir *Alexander Campbell* :—

- 2 “ 8—That the Sixty-first and Sixty-third Rules be dispensed with for the remainder of the Session.

By the Honorable Mr. *Trudel* :—

- 3 “ 8—That he will call the attention of the Government to the urgent need of having borings made by Geological Survey in order to ascertain whether petroleum is found in the geological formations of the banks of the *St. Lawrence*, particularly between *Varennes* and the *St. Maurice River*, at *Point aux Trembles*, near *Quebec*, and on the *Island of Orleans*; and that he will enquire whether it is the intention of the Government to have borings made by the Geological Survey at the places above mentioned?
