Heavy Horse Director Roy Sherrer said it was "one hell of a day" with great support being shown from the community.

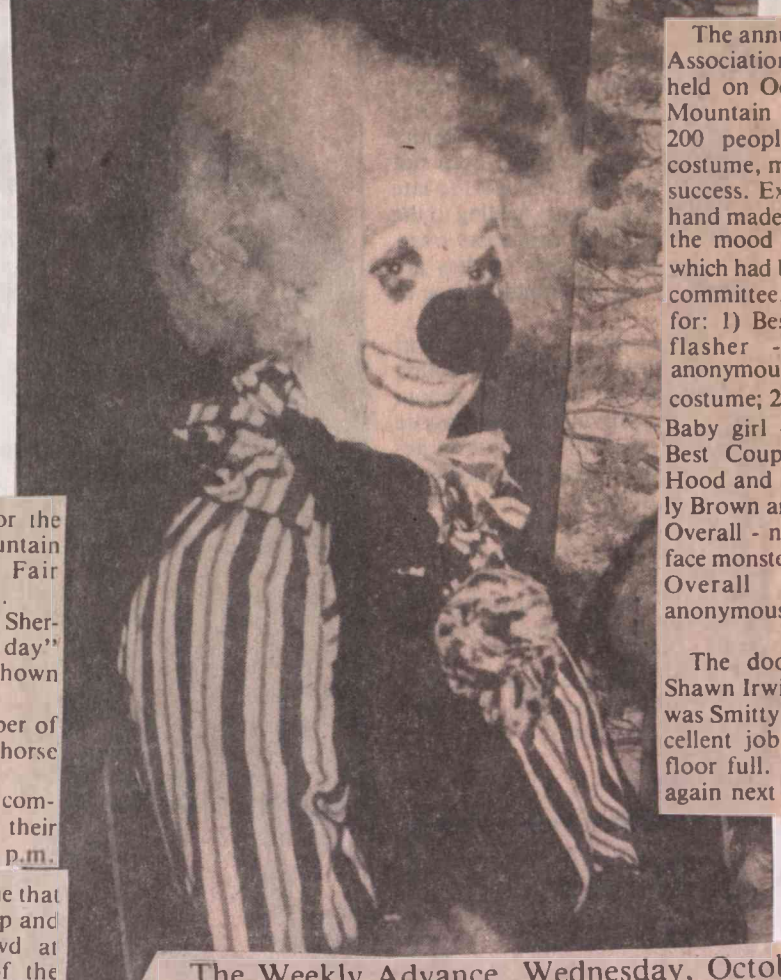
He also thanked the number of sponsors involved with the horse pull on Sunday.
