My dear General:

I found your letter awaiting my return from New York this morning. The passage in my last Sun. sermon which your informant construed into an "attack" upon you was a passing reference. I was speaking on the subject "The Correct Thought about Evil," my main purpose being to show that it was never to be "tolerated." The major part of my sermon was dealing with Judge Codrere's report & Recorder Geoffroy's comment upon it. I said that as long as people apologized for evil & justified it on the ground that it always existed just so long would it exist. I laboured to show that we must work for its abolition, & used as illustrations the expulsion of slavery & duelling so long regarded as inevitable.
