
A PROFILE OF AMERICAN FALL.—American Fall property comprises two prereparating moves, not us aream, as it approaches the fearful brink, is divided by Luna Island and and goes tumbling with increased velocity over the fedge at Centre Fall, on one side, and American Fall on the other.
