

or wall is to be erected or repaired. And from time to time as materials are worked up, the space they occupied shall within 48 hours afterwards be cleared from rubbish by either carrying away or gathering the same into heaps near the gutters. And if more space shall be occupied for such materials by any person or persons than is hereby allowed, or if rubbish be not from time to time cleared away as abovesaid, or if the materials or rubbish finally remaining, after the exterior of the building so built or repaired shall have been finished, shall not be removed within fourteen days, every person so offending shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding twenty shillings, and the same shall afterwards be removed by the said Surveyor at the costs and charges of the person offending. And no person shall slack lime in any square, street or lane within the city or suburbs, under the penalty of ten shillings upon the master-workman ordering or permitting the same to be done.

ART. 4.—All persons in the city and suburbs shall keep their chimnies in good repair, under the penalty of forty shillings, and all vents of chimnies in the city and suburbs shall be left free and open at the top and bottom, in such manner as shall admit of the same being conveniently swept, under the penalty of twenty shillings. Every stove pipe shall pass into a chimney under the penalty of twenty shillings, and no person shall introduce more than two stove pipes, in each story, into any chimney, under the penalty of ten shillings for each offence. And whenever the Inspector of chimnies shall have certified that any chimney or wall is dangerous, either on account of fire or to passengers, or that any vent of a chimney is obstructed so as to prevent the same from being so swept, and upon such certificate two Justices shall have sent notice thereof to the proprietor or tenant, such proprietor or tenant shall immediately cause such chim-
