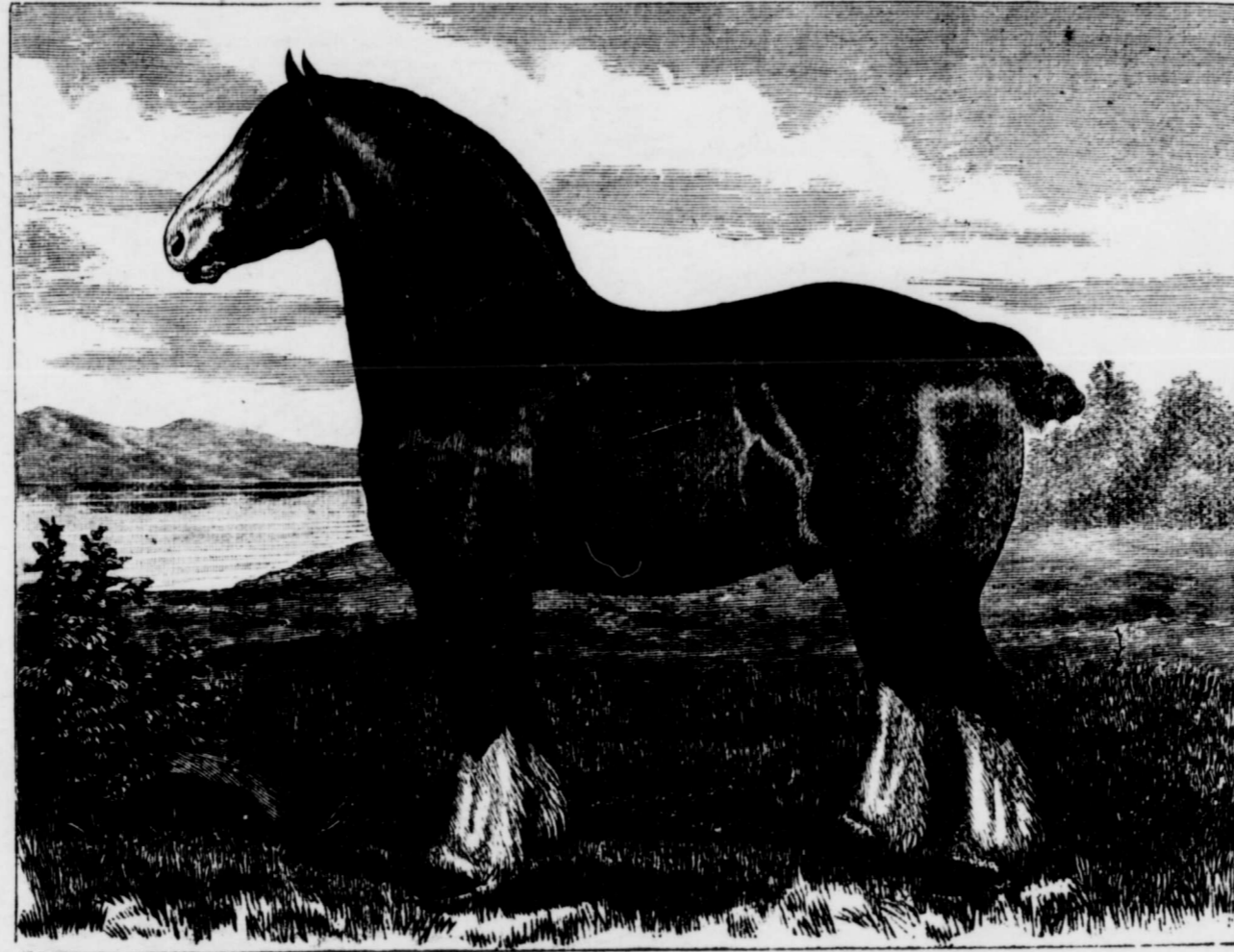

SCOTTISH THISTLE

Will serve mares for the season of 1899 as follows :

MONDAY, afternoon May 8, will leave his own stable, Hampton, and proceed to Tyrone, night.

TUESDAY, proceed to Isaac Chapman's, Leskard, noon; thence to Alex Henry's, lot 16, con. 6, Clarke, night.

WEDNESDAY, proceed to Richard Smith's, lot 3, con. 4, Clarke, noon; thence to Alfred Harness', lot 31, con. 2, Hope, night.

THURSDAY, proceed to Geo. Payne's, lot 7, con. 2, Clarke, noon; thence to Wm. Graham's, lot 17, con. 3, Clarke, night.

FRIDAY, proceed to Thos. Vickers' Estate, lot 32, Con. 5, Clarke, night.

SATURDAY, proceed to his own stable and remain there until the following Monday afternoon.

The above route will be continued during the season, health and weather permitting.

TERMS:---To insure a foal, \$10 ; to be paid on the 1st February, 1900. Mares must be returned regularly or they will be charged full insurance, whether in foal or not. Persons disposing of their mares before foaling time, must pay the insurance whether in foal or not. Groom's fee, 50c. No second price. All accidents to mares at owner's risk.
