

CHICAGO, April 9.—Strength was parted to wheat today by cold weaper, which was reported to be rearding spring seeding, and by talk of gain of 1-2c to 3-4c. Corn made a net advance of 7-8c to 11-8c, oats were up 5-8c to 7-8c and provisions were be to 20c higher.
