The January statement of chartered banks shows a decrease of \$2,984,000 in note circulation for the month, and the total is 35,611,000, as against \$30,208,000 a year ago. Demand deposits decreased \$2,685,000 during January and time deposits increased \$584,000. Discounts increased \$1,600,000, and the total is \$207,532,000, as against \$208,483,000 a year ago. Call loans increased \$142,000, and the total is \$207,000, as against \$13,911,000 a year ago. Balances due our banks from the United States aggregate \$23,015,000, as against \$16,394,000 a year ago. Those due from the United Kingdom are \$15,101,000, as against \$9,623,000 a year ago.
