WHAT HAS BEATEN MR. WHITNEY?

Now that the fight is over, the world takes the liberty of addressing a few words to Mr. Whitney. He made the great mistake of his political career when he allowed the railway bonuses voted by the Hardy Government in the last session (January, 1898) of the recent Legislature to go through in a single night without any protest, without any explanation, nearly two millions of dollars to railway promoters went through in that disgraceful sitting. At the very same moment the notorious Yukon deal was going through the House of Commons at Ottawa and millions more were destined for the railway promoters. It was just before and after these subsidies were voted that the machine began to work with marvelous vigor in the by-elections, both provincial and Federal, and in the provincial general elections in March, 1898. It was the subsidies voted in January, 1898, and which Mr. Whitney allowed to go through without opposition—we have even heard his friends say since that he was "pledged" to let them through which produced the sneers of war that carried Hardy and the Liberals through in the fight of March, 1898, and sustained them yesterday, that maintained the corruption and all the ball-motivated that have disgraced Ontario in 1898 and 1899. And the six millions of railway subsidies that went through at Ottawa last August and the other big votes that went through the Ontario Legislature this spring put the Liberals in a still stronger position to defy public opinion and to let Mr. Whitney and the Hon. James Sutherland (now Hon. James Sutherland) were the two Liberal leaders who championed and negotiated these huge railway grants in both legislatures. Greenway of Manitoba was in it too. But, fortunately, in Manitoba Hugh John Buller fought the railway grants and their money, too, the side of the people as against the subsidy-grabbers and beat them horse, foot and artillery. Mr. Whitney never raised his voice against the legislation that was concocted to destroy him and to keep the Liberals in office in Ontario, Manitoba and the Dominion. The Conservatives and the railway combination and its thousands and thousands of money in Manitoba and the Conservatives will have to fight this same combination in the Federal elections that are to come. Mr. Whitney had better revise his attitude towards the railway grants, for he must know how the Conservatives know now how the Liberal candidate of this same railway combination. The combination professed to deal with the Liberal Government to help them in Ontario, in Manitoba, and in the Dominion election, when it comes; and when making this deal we believe they boasted that they could hypnotize or hush the Conservatives of the Ontario Legislature! If John Macdonald they were not at all deliver the goods. Mr. Whitney must know now what he is up against and he must get on a platform of railway reform and against railway jobs. The people want men and parties who will fight the railway and insist on their full and fair obligations to the public. The people are sick of building up immense fortunes for railway promoters who grab subsidies and supply campaign funds for the political party voting them!

CANADA AND THE POULTRY INDUSTRY.

The possibilities of the British market for the consumption of Canadian poultry may be gauged by the development of the industry in Russia. The Russians began to ship poultry to Great Britain fifteen years ago. During the first two or three years they shipped not more than 100,000 fowls a week, and the shipments continued during the three months of December, January and February. And this big business is done under very unfavorable conditions than exist in Canada. Cold storage is an unknown quantity in Russia. The English poultry dealers have constructed cold stores at three central points in Russia, and these are said to be all the establishments of this kind in the country. For shipping the fowls to London, the dealers have to wait till the weather is suitably warm. A sudden change in the weather is an onerous and involve immense loss on all concerned. The voyage to London involves, on an average, six days by rail and six days by steamer. The railways have no cold storage, while only two of the steamships engaged in the trade are fitted with it. Canada has only a few better facilities for handling it. Cold storage is available all over the country and the railways and steamships are improving their facilities for taking care of perishable products. While Russia is shipping 200,000 fowls a week, that is in the limit for the country accomplished with its present facilities, there is every reason to believe that our exports of turkeys and chickens to Great Britain might soon be increased ten or twenty fold.

THE BOARD OF TRADE RESOLUTION.

We congratulate the Toronto Board of Trade on having so promptly and unanimously come to a conclusion regarding the stand to be taken by its representatives at the Congress of Chambers of Commerce of the Empire, which is to be held in London next year. We are quite certain that every other Board of Trade in the Dominion will approve of the first part of the resolution, which runs as follows: "Resolved, That in the opinion of this Congress, the bonds of the British Empire would be materially strengthened and the welfare of the various parts of Her Majesty's dominion greatly consolidated by the adoption of the principle of mutual benefit, whereby each component part of the Empire should receive a substantial advantage in the form of the result of its national relationship."
