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COLORS PRESENTED TO 149TH LAMBTONS BY COLONEL'S WIFE

Many Friends Witness Ceremony at Park.

PROCEEDINGS INFORMAL

No Invitations Issued by the Staff Owing to Circumstances.

A large delegation representing the board of trade, city council and other public bodies of London, was present today to witness the presentation of colors to the 149th Battalion at Queen's Park.

Although no military ceremony was carried out in connection with the presentation, the regimental colors were formally handed over by Mrs. MacVicar, wife of Lieut.-Col. MacVicar, officer commanding, and the King's colors, by Mrs. Goodwin, wife of W. Goodwin, a member of the battalion.

Owing to the fact that the battalion expects to leave soon, the equipment has practically all been turned in, and the staff is exceptionally busy clearing up the tag-ends of the work, and as a result no invitations were issued by the staff.

The regimental colors bear the crest of the battalion, composed of a ram's head and a wreath of maple leaves, surrounded by the figures 149, and encircled by a band inscribed with the words, "Overseas Battalion."

It has been suggested that the colors be deposited in the county court house, but this has been refused. The colors will be taken to the 149th Battalion at Queen's Park in the morning.

After spending two months at Watford, the battalion headquarters was transferred to London, where it remained until the 14th of July, 1916. Small training squads were billeted throughout the county during this period.

At Grosvenor Camp in this city from May until July, 1916, at Borden Camp from July to October, the battalion has been quartered at Queen's Park in this city.

The 149th Battalion has attained a high efficiency in military discipline.

Today's camp orders announce that Battalion Sergeant-Major Woodrow has been promoted to the rank of sergeant.
