Hay—Ten loads sold at \$15 to \$16 for old

and \$18 to \$19 for new.

Potatoes—Prices steady, at 80c to 85c

per bushel by the load from farmers' wagons.

Butter—The deliveries were large, with

prices steady at 23c to 25c for the bulk.

Some few sales to special customers were

made at 27c per lb.

Eggs—Prices easy, at 23c to 25c per

dozen, and 15c to 16c per lb. for

ducks.

Apples—At 15c to 20c per basket, and

10c to 12c per bushel.
