A New Trial in the Robinson Case. In Her v. Robinson the defendant had been indicted under sub-sect. 2 of sec. 124 of the Criminal Code of 1892, which is as follows: "Everyone who is under legal duty to provide necessaries for his wife is criminally responsible for omitting, without lawful excuse, so to do if the death of his wife is caused or if her life is endangered or her health is or is likely to be permanently injured by such omission."

COAL SCREENINGS. The Manufacturers in Ontario are in Favor of Lower Rates of Duty on Soft Coal. The Council of the Board of Trade met yesterday to consider the report made by the committee appointed on Friday re duties on coal screenings. A resolution was passed by the council, in which it was expressed that representations be made to the Government that the regular output of coal product so supplied by the American mines as soft coal screenings or dust, subject to a duty not exceeding 15 cents per ton.
