There was a very light run of hogs, only 205, hardly enough on which to base a price, but a few good quality, strong, up to 250 over Monday's prices. The receipts were 22 cars, consisting of 201 cwt. 90 calves, 220 hogs and 101 sheep and lambs.

**Honeydew Melons.**  
The first straight car of Honeydew melons to enter Toronto came in yesterday from H. Peters, and sold at \$2.25 per case.
