BRONCHOS DEFEAT LEAFS ON SUNDAY

Knocking Ryan Off Mound in Sixth, While Clifford Pitched Masterly.

Rochester, May 29.—(Special)—Masterly pitching by Jack Clifford, fortified by sensational fielding and intensified by good Broncho hitting, were responsible for the defeat of the Maple Leafs before a holiday crowd today. Duffy's ace, Ryan, quit in the sixth inning with nose out and three on base, after he had been nipped for nine hits. Clifford, who held the game, holding the Bronchos runless in the seventh and eighth. Toronto didn't start much better than a switch in both line-ups. Shortstop O'Rourke was called to Elizabeth, N.J., by the illness of his mother, and Anderson was put at second. Blackburn at short and Gonzales at third. Long played third and Holahan second for Rochester.

Anderson started the first with a single, but the next three were easy outs. After Whitman fled to left in the second, Blackburn singled, but was caught stealing, and Gonzales singled to left. An error started the Bronchos in the third who got to second on it, but was flipped out at third on a bunt to the pitcher. With two down in the fourth, Whitman singled, but Blackburn forced him at second. In the fifth the Leafs went out in order.

Again in the sixth Anderson started off with a single. Spencer hoisted to right and Ryan singled. Onslow hit into a fast double play, but Sanberg whiffed to Rodriguez. Infield taps sent the Leafs back in 1, 2, 3 order in the seventh. The real chance came in the eighth when they looked dangerous.

Sanberg grounded out, short to first. Heck strided to centre. Anderson fouled out. Spencer's fly was dropped by Bowen. Riley punched a single to left, filling the bases. Onslow had three balls and no strikes; then two strikes and finally a fly to centre. Holahan hit. White started the ninth with a pass, but Blackburn hit into a corking double play. White to Holahan to Rody. White making a great stop. Gonzales got a life on Rody's tumble, but Sanberg whiffed. A splendid catch by Anderson, causing a double play, robbed Rody of a hit in the fourth. Rody's fielding was very velvet. White made catches in left, every time he was grand. Leaf hitters. He had five put outs, every one a binger.

Long's safe and a bad throw by Ryan started the Bronchos in the first, putting the runner on third. He scored on Rody's safe throw. Holahan walked, got second on White's infield out and scored on Bowen's single to centre.

In the third, with one down, White walked and Bowen doubled, but Spencer's great throw home caught White at the plate. Matthews dumped a Texas Leaguer to left, three Leafs surrounding it, but none touching it. Holahan singled, scoring Bowen, putting Matty on third. A double steal let in the second run.

Ryan went back in the sixth. Ross doubled to right, Clifford singled, Ryan held at second. Long sacrificed. Rody walked, filling the bases, and Duffy yanked Ryan to a southern larceny on a strike. Kinella, who shot a grounder thru Anderson's legs and both runners scored. The Bronchos played well, but Clifford was invincible, the score not telling half how good he was in pinches. There are two games Monday, morning and afternoon.
