Andrews Asks Law for Private Corporation for Medicinal Supply

WASHINGTON, Nov. 23 .- To solve the problem of replenishing the sup-ply of medicinal whiskey and maintaining it by the distillation of 3,000,-600 gallons annually, the Treasury Department is proposing the creation by Congress of a private corporation which would be a "beneficent monopoly" and would have authority to buy and own all the medicinal spirits in

the country. source of supply for medicinal spirits from the time of its creation. It would provide for the manufacture, under government regulation, of whiskey needed to replenish the supply, and distribute the liquor direct to retail druggists by American Railways Ex-

This is the bomb which the Treas ury is going to throw into the midst of the dispute over the liquor question at the short session of Congress, which begins next month. General Andrews, assistant secretary of the treasury, in charge of prohibition enforcement, declares the legislation is necessary and the plan has the approval of Secretary Mellon. General Andrews had no hesitancy in saving that the present laws are entirely inadequate to prevent diver-sion of medicinal whiskey to beverage uses. He said the law makes the gov ernment responsible for distributing medicinal spirits, but does not give it "adequate power to keep the bus clean and reasonable."

It is not yet certain whether any of the great oil combines will succeed in buying an interest in the new oil-from-coal plant in Central Germany. Experts consider it doubtful, however, that the Germany dysets for the contral forms of the first that the Germany dysets for the contral forms. that the Germany dyestuffs trust, which will control the operation of these works, will allow foreign firms to gain insight into German secret pro-cesses, which are calculated to compete with the natural product. Professor Friedrich Bergius, of Hei delberg, the inventor of the process, has attempted to dampen the ardor of enthusiastic prophets. He discounts reports that his invention will evoke perhaps himself over-zealously seeks to persuade the public that oil-from-coal will not rival the natural product. Other experts suggest that Bergius is eager to conceal the significance of his system until he is ready to enter the world market a large scale. Premature disclosure of the importance of the Bergin process, it is insisted, would put com-

petitors on their guard.

A reckoning of production costs appears to fortify the contentions of enthusiastic Bergin oil advocates. Dr. von Jellinek, of the Bergius laborates. von Jellinek, of the Bergius laboratories at Heidelberg, has computed that oil products, extracted from coal by the Bergin method, will cost 92 Marks (23) per ton—or only 78 Marks (about \$20) a ton, if electrical energy is generated at the plant. Meanwhile, the world market price of the natural product fluctuates between 140 and 190 Marks (\$35-\$47) per ton. To compete with Bergin oil, then, world petroleum prices would have to take a big drop.

Whether the development of the Bergin process will emancipate Germany from foreign oil imports, as the German press suggests, is likely to remain undecided for several years. But experts recall that other scientific achievements in Germany during recent years have performed economic miracles. Thus, the inauguration of the Haber-Bosch process for obtaining nitrogen from air not only spares Ger many a yearly import of approximately 800,000 tons of Chile saltpeter, but now enables Germany to export 185,000 tons of fixed nitrogen annually.

"This performance," it is asserted, "suggests that a parallel development in the oil industry is not unthinkable."

The Bergin process, around which international oil corporations have centered their interest, is not new. Experiments, starting in 1909, led to the issuance of a patent in 1913. The process depends upon the hydrogenation of coal under 100 atmospheres pressure at 480 degrees centigrade for a yield of about 45 per cent. oil which can be refined for gasoline, ammonia can be refined for gasoline, ammo and other end-products.


