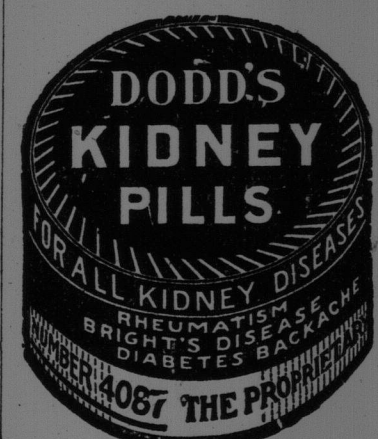

TRIES TO BLOW UP NEWSPAPER OFFICE

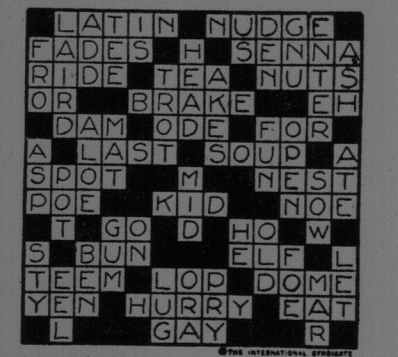

Don'ts For Colds

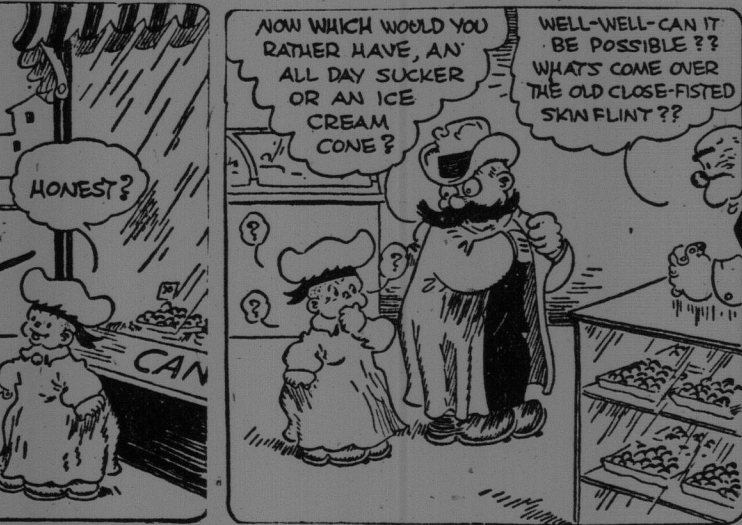

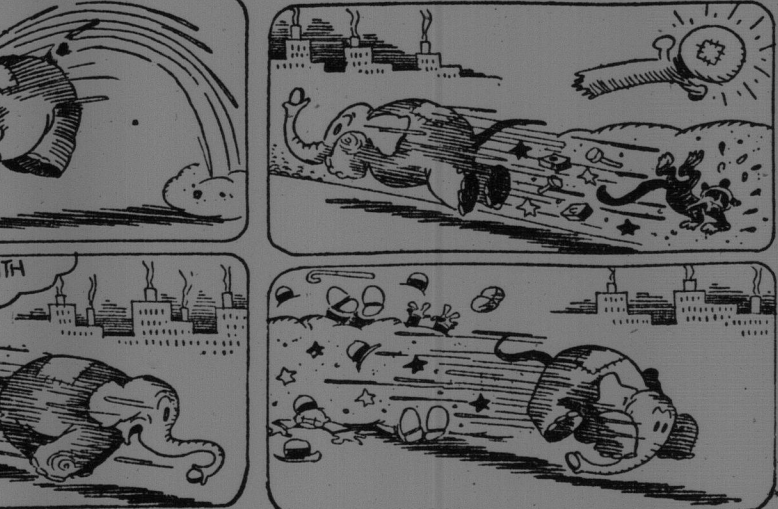

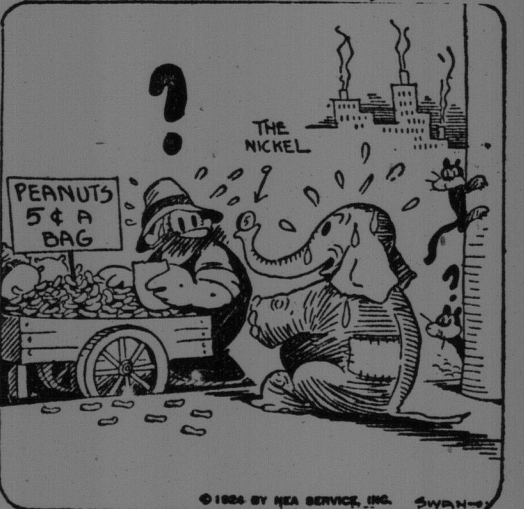
