WOMAN RESCUES CHILD IN FLAMES

Rushes Into Blazing Apartment and Wraps a Rug Around Little Girl—She is Also Burned.

New York, May 30.—Mrs. Stella Dunn was the heroine of a fire on the first floor of a five-story brick house in Brooklyn, in the apartment of Mrs. Alice Brown, recently. Mrs. Brown spilled some kerosene on the floor, and then, before drying it according to the police, she lighted a match to start a fire in the stove and threw the match on the floor. A blaze followed. Mrs. Brown became hysterical, running into the street and crying for help for her daughter, Helen, 7 years old, who was in the apartment.

Mrs. Dunn, a neighbor, heard Mrs. Brown's cries and ran into the burning apartment. She found the little girl with her clothes on fire. Seizing a rug, she wrapped it around the child, extinguishing the flames, although her own face, hands and body were seriously burned. Helen was burned on the hands and face. Mrs. Dunn and the little girl were taken to the Long Island College Hospital in an ambulance.

Firemen quickly put out the blaze. The damage was estimated at about \$1,000.



Montreal, May 30.—Exhausted from lack of food and drink and almost reduced to unconsciousness, two little children, aged 4 1/2 years and 5 1/2 years, who had been missing from their homes since 8 o'clock Thursday afternoon, were discovered locked in a discarded candy van at the Deaf and Dumb Institute yard Sunday afternoon. Their names and addresses respectively are Paul Paradis, 2088 St. Dominique street, and Henri Louis Legendre, 2022 St. Dominique street. They were found by an employee of A. Beauchamp, the owner of the candy van.

The children informed the police of the St. Hubert street station that they had been playing in the shed in the Deaf and Dumb Institute yard, and observing the disused van thought it would make an excellent substitute for the castle of their imagination. They

WOMEN GOOD JURORS. MISS SHERWIN INSISTS


Vote's League Official Says They Show Desire to Be Strictly Just.

Washington, May 30.—Do women make good jurors? The question was answered here, by Miss Belle Sherwin, of Cleveland, first vice-president of the League of Women Voters, who is in Washington for a headquarters conference. She insists not only that women make good jurors, but urges them to seize the opportunity for jury service for its educational value.
Miss Sherwin emphatically disputes the statement of a New York jurist that women are not successful in the jury box. In her opinion not one of the common objections to jury service for women has weight.
"They show a desire to administer strict justice," Miss Sherwin said. "I have seen no evidence of undue emotion."

Look For Fortress Of The Israelites

Expect Much Light on Biblical History.

London, May 17.—(By mail)—R. A. Stewart Macalister, Professor of Celtic Archaeology at the National University of Dublin, will shortly leave for Palestine to supervise excavation work at the site of the old City of David.
Professor Macalister is director of the Palestine Exploration Fund, having succeeded Dr. F. J. Bliss.
Early last year a scheme was started for an excavation of the site of the ancient city.
This, it has been definitely decided, was situated on the eastern hill which runs north of the present City of Jerusalem.
Professor Macalister says it is impossible to say what the fruits of the excavations will be, as Palestine was not a country where art was cultivated to the same extent as in Egypt, but considerable light will, it is hoped, be thrown on Biblical history.
It was in the hope of discovering what were the numerous buildings referred to in Old Testament history as having been fortified by different kings that the present work was undertaken.
The excavations may disclose correspondence tablets used for messages between the Israelites, Egypt, and neighboring cities.

SPRING 16 DAYS BEHIND.

Chicago Records the Coldest May in 52 Years.

Chicago, May 30.—Spring in Chicago is sixteen days behind time, according to Prof. Henry J. Cox, United States Weather Forecaster. May so far has

been the coldest May in the fifty-two years of the Chicago Weather Bureau's existence.

Professor Cox blames the cold wave of the lake for much of the weather in which Chicago has been shivering.

Two years ago, in 1921, just at this time of year, occurred the warmest spring days on record. Between May

20 and 24 the thermometer registered more than 90 degrees.
