Generally quiet conditions ruled in the principal wholesale markets in the United States last week, but prices continued to show an upward tendency, with forty-three gains appearing in the comprehensive list of quotations compiled by Dun's Review, as against thirty-three reductions. In a similar comparison for the previous week fifty-nine advances compared with thirty-one declines, while for the corresponding week a year ago, sixty-

THE TEA MARKET

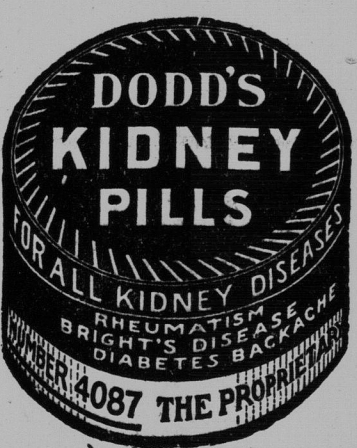

Prices on all varieties of teas are holding firm after the recovery made from the low levels touched early in 1921. The situation at present has resulted from a decided shortage in crops of all the growths, particularly Ceylon, India, Formosa and Japan, the last named having shown such a heavy shrinkage as to admit of importations by the American trade of barely 50 per cent. of the average supply for consumption. The decreased crops have made necessary the absorption of the accumulations of old teas which were a weight on the market, and today the world-wide buyer of a large block of any kind of tea finds it extremely difficult to find a seller, even at prices 50 to 70 per cent higher than the low figures of a few months ago. The outlook for the tea market for the next five or six months, when the new crops are available, is a bright one, so far as prices are concerned.
