Machinery dealers report that they are handling a fair volume of trade. Although it cannot be called large, it is much more than they had expected during the first three or four months following the war. In some circles it is still contended that the actual signing of peace is needed to put things on a right basis for good business. As long as matters stand as they are at present there is room for an unsettling influence to get in its work in a way that is very hard to meet or combat.

There is still a good demand for used equipment; in fact, the bulk of the business being done is in this class of goods.

Makers of tubes, chains, wire ropes, and other lines have hastened to announce that they will not reduce prices, following the cuts in the steel market. Tubes are still much in demand, especially the two-inch kind. There is a feeling that there will have to be reductions in a good many of these lines, now that the pace has been set by the steel group. There are cases where present prices are 200 per cent over the pre-war levels.
