Countess Lent Money AT 4,000 PER CENT

Countess von Treuburg, who has been on trial in Berlin and was found guilty of fraud and blackmail, and also with abetting usury, and was sentenced to fifteen months' imprisonment and to pay a fine of 8875, was a notorious usurer, her rates in some cases having run as high as 4000 per cent a year. She had many prominent victims, some of whom refused to testify against her. Princess Louise of Belgium was one who suffered at her hands, and Lieut. von Alten an army officer, committed suicide.
