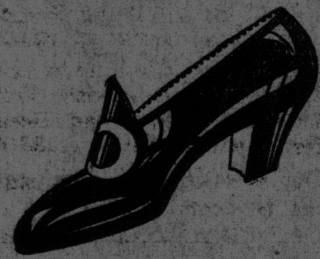

THE LATE SIR WM. WHYTE



Sir William Whyte, C. P. R. director and former vice-president, who died in California after one of the most remarkable railroad careers that Canada has witnessed. He was born in Scotland in 1848, came to Canada in 1868 and worked for the Grand Trunk for the next twenty years as brakeman and in other comparatively humble positions, in 1888 he cast in his fortunes with the C. P. R. and rose rapidly to the position of second vice-president and later vice-president of the road. It was with the west he was chiefly identified, he having for many years managed all the company's lines between Lake Superior and the Pacific Ocean.

THE LATE REV. DR. GRAY

Funeral Services in Sussex Church
—Interment in Cemetery Near
Sussex Corner

Sussex, April 21.—The body of Rev. Dr. Andrew Gray was brought to Sussex on Thursday afternoon accompanied by his brother, Undertaker F. W. Wallace, conveyed the body to his undertaking rooms, and afterwards to Trinity church, where the funeral services took place on Saturday at two p. m.

The rectory, Rev. Canon Smithers of Fredericton, and Rev. F. B. Gaskill, rector of Waterford. The hymns "Peace, Perfect Peace" and "Now the Laborer's Task is O'er," also "Lord, Now Lettest Thou Thy Servant Depart in Peace" were excellently sung by the choir. Rev. Canon Neale gave a short address, in which he paid a glowing tribute to the memory of the deceased. He said in part—

"We are here today to pay respect and mourn the loss of an aged priest of God's holy church. He has spent his life here upon earth in the work of the Divine Master pointing out, teaching, and leading us to that crown of life which is incorruptible, undecaying, and that fades not away. As a scholar, as a writer, and as a minister of God's church, he may well be classed as one of the great men. Although most of his life was spent in the American church, where he labored faithfully yet many of us have, from time to time, listened to his voice and eloquence within these very walls. He has spent his lifetime here upon earth in the work which he so much loved. A great man passed away because of his zeal for God and the work of his sacred calling. At duty he always was ready and willing to do the right in the death of Rev. Dr. Gray the church has sustained a great loss. Now he has gone, may we well trust and hope, to receive his reward."

Many beautiful floral offerings were placed upon the casket by relatives and friends in this part. One was a beautiful wreath with several nice carnations indicative of the number of years of his age; another a beautiful cross from friends in Boston, Mr. and Mrs. Andrews, R. Croome, Mr. and Mrs. Rick H. Jones. Word had been received here that a short funeral service was held in London by the rector of the parish where Rev. Dr. Gray died before the body was sent to New Brunswick. Doctor Gray was sailing only six hours. He was among friends, however, and all was done that loving friends and medical skill could do for him. His death was due to heart attack. He talked with those around

TO MAINTAIN OUR HONOR

(Canadian Courier)

Not because we desire paternalism in our government, but because we desire to maintain our national honor at home and abroad, we need new laws to

(1) Prevent any board of directors from issuing common stock as a bonus or without adding to the resources of the company.

(2) Prevent any land speculator from selling town lots in a subdivision which has not been approved by a provincial government and countersigned by a municipality.

(3) Prevent any city or town issuing debentures which have not been approved or advisable and necessary by a provincial municipal board.

(4) Ensure that every man who acts dishonestly in the public sale of lands, stocks, bonds or securities of any description shall be speedily brought to justice by a public prosecutor.

These laws we need to protect the savings of our weaker citizens and to preserve our credit in the money markets of the world. Finally, such laws are necessary to maintain our own good opinion of ourselves and our own sense of national honor.
