CROOK OPENS SAFE
BY MEANS OF HIS SENSE OF TOUCH

Faculty Wonderfully Developed—
Most Renewed Safe-Cracker
of a Century Piles His Art Through the Power of His Finger Tips

If the question were put to the average person as to which of the five senses is most important to his daily use, would the answer be the sense of touch? Answered off-hand, it would undoubtedly be no, but upon taking the subject a little deeper, considering the arguments of the most prominent human biologists, and after all taking the remarkable examples which the last few years have brought forth, the answer would be yes.

Were the child unable to be released in a very short time it would mean her death. The only recourse is in Jimmy's power to open the safe in the manner of the old days before his reformation. Doyle, a detective who has pursued Jimmy since his release from Sing Sing, is close upon his heels, but he is not the man he seems to be. Jimmy's bravery and sense of honor overbalances his fear of prison, and he hesitates not a moment. The darkened room Jimmy blindfolded, the tense stillness, in which nothing is heard but the scrape, scrape, scrape of the hand paper Jimmy's finger tips, which he uses until the blood drips and the sensitive nerves of the fingers are exposed, makes one and all sit on the edges of their seats, and finally when it is over, the child rescued, and Doyle moved by his better self to drop the pursuit of Jimmy, withdraws, and all sigh of relief and gratitude is expressed that they have witnessed one of the best plays which they have seen in years.

The Thompson-Wood Stock Company has been carefully selected and well cast. Mrs. Frances Brandt, leading woman, will play the part of Rose Lane, Jimmy's sweetheart, while the leading man, Samuel Meharry, in the role of Jimmy Valentine, will have ample opportunity to demonstrate that he is one of the best leading men available for stock today.

VIOLA REID IS WEAKENING UNDER STRAIN OF TRIAL

The trial of Violet Reid, charged with the murder of her infant son, was begun yesterday in the circuit court before Judge White. During the proceedings in the afternoon session the prisoner broke down several times as she sat in the dock, and appeared to be greatly worried over her position. Many in the court room sympathized with her deeply in her predicament. There were five witnesses examined in the afternoon and three in the morning. The case was adjourned about 4 1/2 p. m. until this morning. Attorney-General Grimmer and B. L. Gerow conducted the case for the crown and P. A. Guthrie appeared for the defence.

The first witness called in the afternoon was David Duplissies, of Fredericton Junction. Examined by Mr. Gerow, he said he had accompanied Violet Reid for some distance up the track from Fredericton Junction station, where he had met her. He had carried her suitcase for her and noticed that it was unusually heavy. About a quarter of a mile up the track he had left her and had last seen her going over the fence in the direction of the school house, near which she had said she was to meet her father. She had told the witness that she was coming from Truro.

Mr. Guthrie, witness said he had left the prisoner about 7:30 o'clock and had not seen her again that night. He explained that the place where the body had been found was about fifteen minutes' walk from the station and some 200 yards from the track. He said that there was nothing unusual in taking the road followed by the prisoner.

Simon Burns, of Fredericton Junction, gave evidence along the same lines as the previous witness and Mary Virtue, formerly matron of the Evangelical Home, told of the prisoner going there and of the birth of the child.

When the girl left the home she had said that her ultimate destination was Sackville, where she was going to leave the child for a few days, and return to Tracy. Her brother had taken some clothes away in a grip, witness said, in answer to a question as to whether the prisoner had two suitcases.

On cross-examination the witness spoke of the treatment the prisoner had received at the home. She explained that both the father and brother of the girl must have known of the child's birth.

Dr. A. Edward Loggie was next called. He said that he had attended the prisoner at the home after the child had been born and said she had called at his office about a week before her arrest. She had asked the doctor whether or not he would mention that a child had been born if questioned by Chief Rideout. He had told her he would not, as he had not attended the case.

The prisoner had told the doctor that the child was in Michigan and appeared to be much affected over losing it.
