KILLS WIFE, THREE CHILDREN AND HIMSELF

Muncie, Ind., Jan. 5.—William Miller, 80 years, shot and killed his wife and three children and then committed suicide yesterday, so police officials said. According to Coroner F. J. Downing Mrs. Miller's body was found in bed and in her arms was found the body of her 11 months old child. The bodies of the other children were on the floor as was that of Miller.

Mrs. Miller and the children were in their night attire and Miller was partly clothed. A revolver was found on the floor near Miller's body. The theory was advanced by Coroner Downing that Miller became temporarily insane and shot his family.

The death of Mrs. J. Willard Smith, wife of a well known shipping merchant of this city, occurred yesterday in the Royal Victoria Hospital, Montreal, following an operation. She was Miss Fannie Hanson, of Durham Ridge, before her marriage and taught school in St. John for a time. She is survived by her husband, two sons, Harold and Roy; four daughters, Ella, Helen, Annie and Jean; one sister, Mrs. E. Bliss McLeod, of Fredericton, and five brothers, Norman, Robert, Burpee, David and Wesley Hanson, of Durham Ridge. Mrs. Smith was well known as a worker in the Children's Aid Society and in the Child Welfare committee of the Local Council of Women.
