

"Under such circumstances, it is, as I have said, impos-"sible for the Government to alter the original compact between these Corporations and the public, under which "the aid, to which I have before referred, was promised by the Corporation of this city in 1870, and by Montreal in 1872, a compact which the Government are now in duty bound to carry out."
