To be eligible for this scholarship, candidates must take first class in the ordinary work of their year, and the same in the following special work: Hebrew Grammar (Rodiger's Gesenius), Elements of Chaldee Grammar (Bagster's), The Book of Daniel.

For general proficiency in the pass work of their year and in the special subjects mentioned on page 12.

REGULATIONS REGARDING ACADEMIC REWARDS.

Students who, for any reason, may desire to repeat the studies of an Academic year, are required to obtain the consent of the Faculty for their doing so; and students gaining such permission, shall not be eligible for the scholarships and other rewards of the year.

No student shall be entitled to rank in the first class in Honours or to receive a scholarship who has not obtained two-thirds of the imum of marks at which the examination is valued.

The first schelarship of the First and Second years and the gold medal shall be awarded to the student who stands first in the first class of Honours in the respective years, provided always that the candidate for the gold medal has obtained three-fourths of the result of the examination.

The second scholarship of the First and Second years and the silver medal shall be awarded to the student who stands next in rank in the first class of Honours.

The medalists of the Third year are equally eligible with other students of that year for the Hugh Mackay and Anderson scholarships.
