Amendment. It was moved in amendment by Mr. Skinner, seconded by Mr. Ewing, that the Addresses delivered on the celebration of this Tri-centenary be published in the Magazine.

Published in Magazine. A vote being taken, the amendment was carried by a large majority, and the Synod did and do agree that the Addresses be published in the Magazine.
