

CHARITABLE BEQUESTS OF A LATE N. Y. MERCHANT.

The last will and testament of Seth Grosvenor, Esq., was proven yesterday at the Surrogate's Office, says the New York Journal of Commerce. It gives the sum of \$10,000 each to the following institutions:

- The Lyngin Asylum; Asylum for Old Ladies; American Bible Society; American Society for Ameliorating the Condition of the Jews; American Home Missionary Society; American Sunday School Union; Colonization Society; American Tract Society; Presbyterian Board of Education; Mercantile Library Association; New York Boy's Institute Society; Institution for the Blind; Deaf and Dumb Asylum; New York Hospital.

It also donates to the Board of Education of the City of New York \$30,000, payable in two years after the date of decease, to be invested there, and the income expended in books to form a library for the Free Academy. The Board of Education are allowed, however, should they think it more beneficial, to give some portion of the income, not exceeding \$500 a year, for the purchase of books for any of the ward schools.

Should the testator direct that the Board of Education ever cease to exist, the bequest is then to pass into the possession of the corporation, who are desired to carry out the views and wishes of the testator as expressed in his donations to the Board of Education.

All the gifts to public institutions located in New York, amount to the very magnificent sum of \$70,000.

Mr. Grosvenor has also bequeathed to the Corporation of the City of Buffalo the sum of \$0,000, payable two years after his decease, 10,000 dollars, which is to be expended in a lot and building thereon, unless the city shall give a lot for the purpose, in which case the \$10,000 shall be expended on the building, which is intended for a public library, and the remainder to be invested forever, and its income used in the purchase of books. The testator directs that the building shall be always kept for the use of the public, and that the books shall be read on the premises.
