That, and the similar weekly statement of the Bank of France, came in the list of influences already passed. The casing discount rate, on the contrary, was of some effect in relaxing the foreign exchange market in New York. Another influence on the foreign exchange market was the settlement of the Manchester cotton spinners' dispute and the impetus thus given to the foreign demand for cotion.
