From the Irish Love Ireland - By Lady Gregory



Lady Augusta Gregory is a well known woman, not only in her native Ireland, but wherever literature goes. For years she translated early Gaelic into English, and her fairy tales are considered classics. She recently paid her first visit to America with the National Irish Players. She was one of the founders, 11 years ago, of the little band of actors and actresses who play at the Abbey Theatre, Dublin. While Lady Gregory has done much for dramatic art she is best known for her patriotism through her study of the Irish language.

What is it that is so much loved in Ireland, with its bogs, with its stones, its rain-rotted harvest, its green skies? And the love of it is there, that is certain.

I remember once when I was a child, taking notice of a flowerpot hidden in the corner of a melon farm, having two little ivy plants growing in it. I wondered how it came there, and why so common a thing as ivy should be so cherished. Then an old garden man told me it was for his daughter who was going to America "the way the world never be without a bit of Irish earth."

I was passing not long ago by a roofless long-deserted cottage near Kiltartan and a neighboring woman told me that a few years ago a well-to-do man had come from America, son or grandson of the last who had lived there, and had taken two stones from the wall and taken them back to America. It has always been so. That little Ireland has held the hearts of men through the ages.

One of the oldest of the stories tells how when the Sons of Fuireann came back wounded and dying from their terrible journey across the sea, one of them called out that he saw the Hill of Howth before him and Tara of the Kings. And the others said "For the love of your good name, brother, raise up our heads, till we see Ireland again, and life and death will be all one to us after that."

And another of the early tales tells how one of the strong men, Finn of the old Fenians, said when a great queen offered all that riches could give: "We would not give up our own country if you had the whole world belonging to you, and the Country of the Young along with it." It was so with the sailor, Lister, of Columelle going to his exile: "There is a gray eye that is looking back upon Ireland; it will never see from day to day the men or the women of Ireland. Take my blessing with you to the west; my heart is broken with you; if death should overtake me suddenly, it is through great love of the Gael."

And when a crane that has been driven by the storm from Ireland lay fished on the Scottish coast, it was Columelle who told his people to tend and feed it until it had strength to face the journey back again. "And I give this bird to your special care," he said "because it is from our own country it comes." For Ireland was never out of Columelle's mind and it is what he used to say: "The Gael are more to me than all the people of the world."

I was writing about this compelling love of country to a friend the other day, and I quoted words I have myself given to Finn when after long absence he had the death of Diarmid and takes Grania as his wife: "I thought

NEW DONALDSON LINER
(Glasgow Herald.)

Scott's Shipbuilding and Engineering Company, Limited, Greenock, launched yesterday the steel twin-screw steamer Letitia, which they have built to the order of the Donaldson Line (Donaldson Brothers, Glasgow) for their service between the Clyde and Canada. A large party was invited to the ceremony. The naming ceremony was performed by Miss Grace Donaldson.

The Letitia is handsomely modelled and well equipped. Her principal dimensions are—Length between perpendiculars 470 feet; breadth (moulded), 56 feet 8 inches; depth (moulded), 33 feet 8 inches; the shelter deck, above which are fitted, poop bridge, forecastle, and boat decks. The vessel has been designed for the emigrant trade, and takes the highest class of passengers. The accommodation for second class passengers is fitted on the bridge, saloon, and upper decks, state-rooms being provided for over 300 passengers of this class. The dining saloon, music-room, waiting-room, and smoke-room, are handsomely and polished hardwood and very comfortably furnished. Special attention has been given to the culinary department, and the galley and pantry arrangements are very extensive and well equipped with all the latest improvements. Accommodation is also fitted on the shelter upper, and main decks for about 600 third class passengers, principally in two and four berth state-rooms. Separate dining saloons and recreation rooms are fitted for this class, and a special feature has been made of their lavatory accommodation, which includes baths and wash-basins, supplied with both hot and cold water.

to leave you and to go from you and I cannot do it. For we three have been these seven years as if alone in the world, and it was the cruelty and malice of love made its sport with us when we thought it was our own way we were taking and we were all as if worsted in that play; and now there are but the two of us left, and whether we love or hate one another, it is certain I can never feel love or hatred for any woman from this out, or you yourself for any other man." And that, I said in my letter, is what I feel about Ireland, there is no other country for me forever.

What is the reason of it? I think of Pascal's saying "the heart has its reasons unknown to reason." A passionate restless spot of land, almost complaining, making its outcry, it is surely not easy to forget it. I think the very quarrels make it dearer to the attacks made even upon oneself; the bulls written in English of England in its offspring, or the boasting and vanity of France.

It is as if we who have possessed the body of Ireland are alone able to discover its soul—the soul that underlies religion, history, politics, its eternal truth. The air is filled with memories: If Englishmen sing, it is some new song that has caught the fancy, they do not set in it fighters or patriots; it would seem an affection something outside their own pleasure, to sing of Drake or Sydney or of Nelson or Gordon. But there is hardly a phase of Irish history that does not come quite naturally and without effort to the mind of the Gael. I have heard a ragged lad in Galway sing of Brian the Great and his battle against the Danes at Clontarf that was fought 900 years ago. The ballad, written in English, and sung at fairs and markets are

large cargo, there being five holds worked by ten derricks and ten steam winches. The steering gear is of the Wilson and Pirrie type, controlled by a telescope. A very complete installation of electric light has been provided, and electric fans and bells are fitted throughout. A system of wireless telegraph will also be installed.

The machinery, which has been constructed by the builders, consists of two sets of triple-expansion engines. The propelling machinery has been built to Board of Trade and Lloyd's special survey. Six single-ended boilers, each having three Morrison suspension furnaces and working under natural draught, supply steam to two sets of three-cylinder triple-expansion engines driving two screws. The high-pressure cylinder is 26 inches diameter, the intermediate 43 1/2 inches diameter, and the low-pressure 72 1/2 inches diameter. Piston valves control the steam to the h. p. cylinders, Andrews' valves are fitted to the m. p. cylinders, and double ported slides to the l. p. cylinders. The columns and bedplate are of substantial box section. The condensers, circular in form, are carried on seatings from the tank top and are supported by brackets from the main deck. Duplicate sets of electric generating machinery supply current for the lighting of the vessel and power for cabin and saloon ventilating fans, etc.

During construction the vessel has been under the supervision of Captain Taylor and Mr. Innes, the superintendent of Donaldson Line.

The new steamer Letitia is stated will make her maiden trip to St. John during next month and will be on the regular route between St. John and Glasgow during the winter of 1912-13.
