

Portland, Me, May 24—The British grain laden steamer Daleby sailed yesterday forenoon for Rotterdam. The Carlton, loading at the No. 3 wharf for Avonmouth, will not get away for several days. It is reported that she will not go out loaded to her full capacity but will take about 280,000 bushels. 
