LUMBER BARGES. More Wheat Held Than a Year Ago. Ottawa, Aug. 13.—In view of allegations as to congestion of wheat at terminal points in order to hold for high prices, figures issued by the government today are interesting. They show that wheat stored at Eastern terminal and public elevators at present totals 15,333,667 bushels as compared with 10,766,744 bushels a year ago.

Murdered in New York. Toronto, Aug. 13.—W. G. Martin, milliner from Toronto, was found murdered on Tuesday night in a furnished room in New York. He was bound and gagged when discovered. His head was bruised and behind his ears were two stab wounds. The theory is that he was lured to the house for the purpose of robbery. The police are looking for a Mr. and Mrs. Johnson who lived for a week in the room where the murder occurred. The murdered man was born in Stouffville, Ontario, and was unmarried. Since coming to Toronto he had built up an extensive and fashionable clientele.
